In this graphic novel, Mizuki Ashiya disguises herself as a boy so she can attend school with her crush, Izumi Sano.

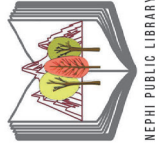
***To All the Boys I've Loved Before*** by **Jenny Han**

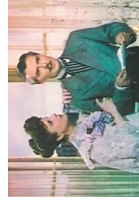
**June 3 *As You Like It* (1936)**

**June 17 *An Ideal Husband* (1947)**

A marriage is tested when a wife with high ethical standards discovers her husband is being blackmailed in Oscar Wilde's witty and thought-provoking comedy.



**June 24 *Pygmalion* (1938)**

Professor Higgins bets he can pass off working-class Eliza Doolittle as an aristocrat with a linguistic makeover. This adaptation was produced with input from playwright George Bernard Shaw.

#### **Bright Ruined Things** by Samantha Cohoe

Mae yearns to master the magic that has brought her benefactors, the Prosper family, great wealth—but at what cost? This YA novel was inspired by Shakespeare's play *The Tempest*.

As a favor, John pretends to be his friend Max to cover on a pet-sitting job for Max's dotty aunt. Things get complicated when he falls for the aunt's neighbor Mel who thinks he's someone he's not.



#### **Red, White, and Royal Blue** by Casey McQuiston

To repair an international scandal, Alex, the son of the US President, befriends his arch-nemesis, Prince Henry, in a publicity stunt that turns into something much deeper.

#### **Charley's Aunt** by Brandon Thomas

Set in Oxford, two students force a colleague to dress up as a matronly chaperone so they can woo their sweethearts before they're forced to leave town in this Victorian-era farce.



#### **Making Oscar Wilde** by Michele Mendelssohn

Combining new evidence and gripping cultural history, this biography dramatizes Wilde's rise, fall, and resurrection as a literary and cultural figure with transatlantic influence.



#### **Oscar Wilde and a Death of No Importance** by Gyles Daubeney Brandreth

The celebrated writer Oscar Wilde teams up with his friend Arthur Conan Doyle to investigate the murder of a young man.

#### **The Count of Monte Cristo** by Alexandre Dumas

A sincere and hard-working sailor had everything going for him—until he was betrayed by jealous rivals and unfairly imprisoned. Now he devotes his life to sweet revenge.



#### **Love in the Afternoon** by Lisa Kleypas
