using an iPad for digital photography

Digital photography reaches a whole new level with the iPad.

- 1 CREATE A SLIDESHOW USING ANIMOTO.**
The Animoto app allows you to create incredible slideshow videos using still images. Pro accounts are free for teachers.
- 2 SHARE PHOTOS FROM CLASS USING INSTAGRAM.**
The Instagram app is the fastest way to share photos from class with parents and students--great for building community with your students.
- 3 TRY ADVANCED EDITING WITH PHOTOSHOP TOUCH.**
The Photoshop Touch app is tad pricier than many apps, but it's great for advanced photo editing, including features such as layers, filters, pixel-level selections and more.
- 4 GET ANIMATED WITH STOPMOTION STUDIO PRO HD.**
The Stopmotion Studio Pro HD app is a fantastic tool for creating Stop Motion Animation videos. It even has an onion skinning for added fun.
- 5 SHARE IMAGES USING YOGILE.COM.**
Have students share photos as a visual assessment of class concepts. Create a photo library and have students share password protected images.
- 6 CAPTURE YOUR SCREEN WITH SKITCH.**
The Skitch app helps you capture your iPad screen and create custom annotations such as titles and captions.
- 7 EDIT IMAGES WITH IPHOTO.**
Before you buy dozens of photos apps, try the iPhoto app. It has tools for numerous editing tasks such as color correction, filters and more.
- 8 MAKE A MOVIE WITH IMOVIE.**
The iMovie app allows students to create movies from still shots imported from your camera.
- 9 ACCESS PHOTOS USING DROPBOX.**
Use the Dropbox app to store your photos in the cloud without using your iPad storage. Dropbox gives 2 GB of storage for free.

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
