Tesselations have been traced back to encientcultures and can also be found in nature.


MC Escher was an artist who became famous for his fontastic tesselations.

- 5. If you want to try a more complicated tesselation repeat steps 3 and 4 on the other two sides (B.D)
  - Frace your pottern onto a 9 x 12 art paper. Does it tesselate? (Fit with no spaces)
- If it does then continue tracing your pattern until you fill up the entire page.
