## NAPKIN FOLDING

THE BOOK: Formal and reserved. Looks well on a plate. Good for stag dinners.

1. Fold edges into thirds.
2. Turn left and right ends in $1 / 4$ each. 5
3. Both ends to center again.
4. Fold right side under.
5. Flatten bottom and top of book leaving center fold up as a leaf.

ASCOT TIE: A quickie lends intself to all-over print. Decorates a plate.

1. Fold in $1 / 2$ large triangle, point at top.
2. Turn up $1 / 4$ and again $1 / 4$.
3. Turn left point right of top point, and right point to left.

BUFFET SERVER: Perfect for holding silver when there is a crowd.

1. Fold in half with open ends at top. Fold down open top to middle of fold.
2. Turn face down.
3. Fold over four times, from left to 2. right.
4. Turn face up; put silver in pocket.

CANDLE: A charming accent for height. Very special for birthdays or Christmas. Trim with balls of greens.

1. Fold into large triangle point at top. 4. Roll tightly left to right.
2. Turn bottom edge up one inch. 5. Tuck in corner. Stand upright.
3. Turn folded edge face down.

BISHOP'S HAT: Standing formal fold, used by finest hotels and restaurants.

1. Fold into triangle; center point down.
2. Fold right and left points to center point.
3. Fold top corner down to one inch bottom point.
4. Turn folded point back to upper edge. Turn over.
5. Fold right and left points across over-lap, one inside the other.
6. Stand and turn down two upper corners for fleur de-lys.

PINWHEEL: Ideal to center on beautiful china.

1. Bring top and bottom edges to $1 / 4$ inch of center, leaving $1 / 2$ inch along center line.
2. Pleat sharply from left edge.
3. Pinch center together, secure with napkin clip.
4. Spread out pinwheel.

FANCY FAN: Versatile fold with many variations. Attractive in goblets.

1. Fold bottom up 3 inches below top.
2. Fold top down to cover edge.
3. Pleat in sharp creased $11 / 2$ inches wide, starting at left.
4. Clip pleats together at bottom.
