(Supplementary)

- 1. Corpus Luteum: the yellow, glandular body that is formed in the ovary from the follicular remains.
- 2. D&C: dilation and curettage, a common minor operation on women.
- 3. Dysmenorrhea: painful menstruation.
- **4. Endometriosis:** fragments of the endometrium in abnormal places.
- Follicle-Stimulating Hormone (FSH): a substance which brings to life a few of the ovum in one of the ovaries.
- **6. Hymen:** a narrow fold of tissue encircling the entrance to the vagina.
- **7. Hysterectomy:** surgical removal of uterus.
- **8. Labia majora:** two folds of skin running from the mons pubis to below the vaginal opening.
- 9. Labia minora: two smaller folds of tissue which lie just within the labia majora.
- **10.** Luteinizing Hormone (LH): causes the follicle to burst, and allows ovum to fall into the opening of the fallopian tube.
- **11. Menopause:** the remaining ova no longer ripen or develop.
- **12. Orgasm:** characterized by the massive release of muscle tension which has built up during excitement.
- **13. PMS:** Premenstrual Syndrome.
- **14. Toxic Shock Syndrome:** caused by bacteria that live in the vagina, which then multiply and causes infection.
- **15. Tubal ligation:** an operation for sterilization of women.
- 16. Vulva (VULL-vah): woman's external genital area.
