Primary vocabulary

1. **Moral values:** What is right or wrong; thoughts or codes by which to live.
2. **Aesthetic values:** Values that reflect your feelings about what has beauty in nature and life. They reveal appreciation for the way things look, sound, feel, taste, and smell.
3. **Material values:** Material values reflect the possessions we own; the things on which we spend our money.
4. **Intrinsic values:** Intrinsic values are things or ideas that have value to us in their own right; the end and not the means. For example, a friend has intrinsic value because of his/her character and personality. An antique car is valued for its beauty.
5. **Extrinsic values:** Some values are important because they help us gain other values or desired results. For example, you value one friend because the friend can help you be popular or you value the antique car because of its monetary value.
6. **Universal values:** Universal values are values on which all or most people agree, such as equality, justice, worldwide brotherhood, respect of self, and others.
7. **Group specific values:** Group specific values are those that differ from state to state or region to region. For example, the U.S. citizens value time and are always in a hurry; Europeans value people and spend time talking.
