

Supply List for Mondo Bag

4 pieces of fabric $\frac{1}{4}$ yard wide for the outside (Can be 4 coordinating prints, all 1 color, or 2 different ones)

1 $\frac{1}{2}$ yards of fusible interfacing (should be at least medium weight, heavy works, but is harder to sew)

4 pieces of fabric $\frac{1}{4}$ yard wide for the inside of the back (Again you can choose 4 coordinating prints, all 1 color, or 2 different ones)

$\frac{3}{4}$ yard of fusible fleece (you can lay the pieces cross grain on the fusible fleece)

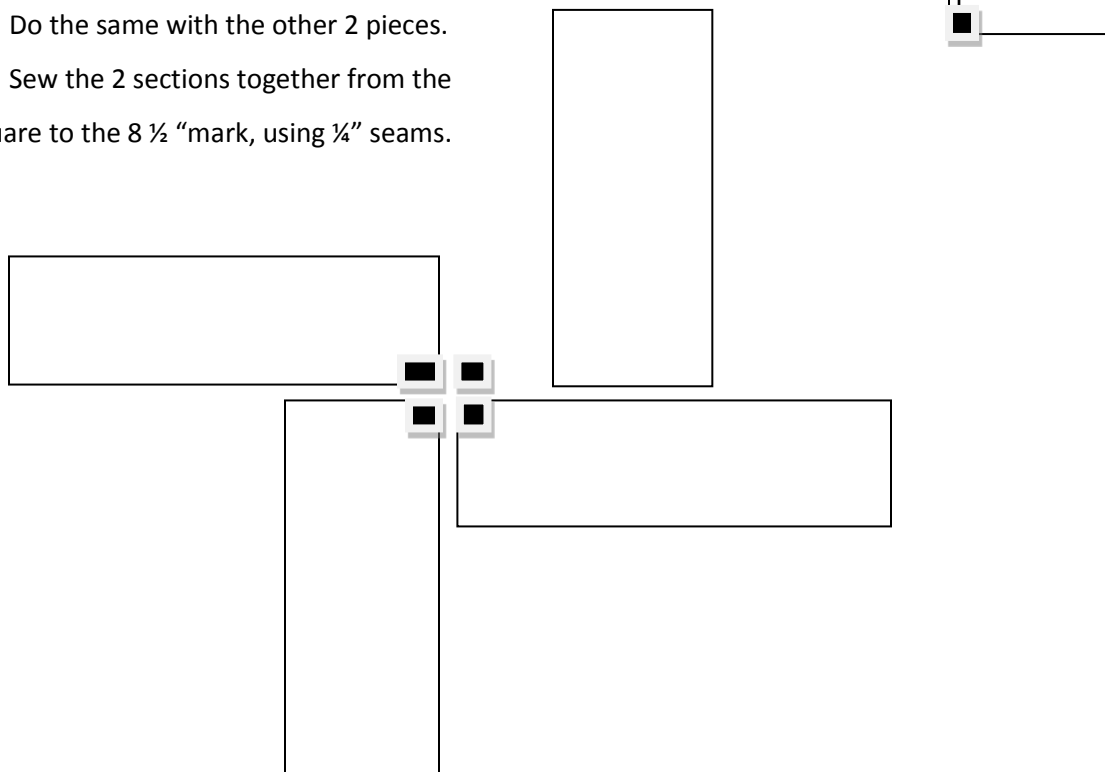
You will also need 2 strips of fabric $2\frac{1}{2}$ " by 26" for the straps and 2 strips of fabric $2\frac{1}{2}$ " by 26" of lining fabric. (The outside straps will need interfacing ironed on to them and the lining straps will need to have the fusible fleece ironed on to them.)

Instructions for Mondo Bag

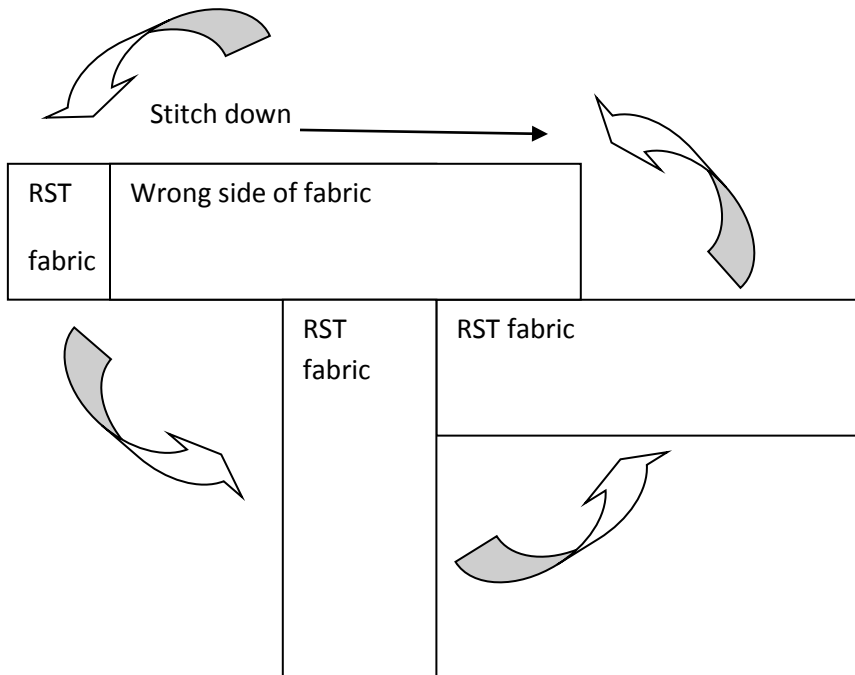
1. Cut 4 pieces of fabric $8\frac{1}{2}$ " wide by $27\frac{1}{2}$ " long.
2. Press interfacing to the back of each piece of fabric. Use steam, press but do not slide the iron.
3. Mark $8\frac{1}{2}$ " from one short end up on the left side of each piece of interfacing.
4. Mark a square in each bottom left corner.

5. Match 2 bottom squares forming an L shape.
6. Do the same with the other 2 pieces.
7. Sew the 2 sections together from the square to the $8\frac{1}{2}$ " mark, using $\frac{1}{4}$ " seams.



8. Sew the 2 sections together, using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam so that the bottom forms a square.

9. Fold one side to meet the other side right sides together. Stitch down the seam using a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Continue for all four sides. You should have a bag with points sticking up.



10. Create the lining by using 4 pieces $8\frac{1}{2}$ " wide and $27\frac{1}{2}$ " long.

11. Iron fusible fleece to each of these 4 pieces.

12. Mark $8\frac{1}{2}$ " from one short end up on the left side of each piece of fleece.

13. Mark a square in each bottom left corner.

14. Match 2 bottom squares forming a backwards L shape. (The lining needs to be opposite the bag, or they will not go together correctly.)

15. In one of the lining sides, leave a 3" opening, for turning the bag right side out.

16. Pin one outside strap to one lining strap and sew down both long sides. Turn right side out. Do the same for the other strap. Top stitch down both long sides of the handle.

17. Pin the straps to the right side of the bag, making sure to not twist the handles. Sew across.

18. Place the lining inside the bag, right sides together. Pin around the top edge. Stitch around the top edge, pivoting at the points. Clip the inner corners to the stitching.

19. Turn bag right side out, through the opening in the lining. Hand or machine stitch the lining closed. Top stitch around the top edge of the bag.
