The learn-bydoing approach to this curriculum will change how financial literacy education is received in the classroom enabling you to teach financial literacy regardless of your level of expertise!

The Utah 4-H & Fidelity Investments® Money Mentors Curriculum consists of six, one-hour lessons that incorporate the do, reflect, apply method of experiential learning within the framework of icebreaker introductions, lesson materials and activities, a wrap up/recap of each concept and a homework assignment. This curriculum is a free download available at: www.discoverutah4h.org. The six lessons are:

- 1. Planning for Success (money values, habits, attitudes, determining a financial game plan, allocating funds)
- 2. Creating a Spending Blueprint (needs vs. wants, allocating income, decreasing expenses, decision making, creating your spending blueprint, making it stretch)
- 3. Save Your Bacon; Share Your Bacon (savings principles, paying yourself first, financial goal setting, opportunity cost, charitable giving, volunteering time)
- 4. Credit: Know Your Stuff (the good and bad about credit, responsibilities of borrowers and lenders, credit costs)
- 5. Discover a Dollar's Potential (compound interest, saving doesn't not equal investing, time value of money, the rule of 72, diversification)
- 6. Invest in Yourself (human capital, value of education, earning potential, lifestyle influences, career planning)
