UNIT IV: Gals and Guys

TOPIC A: Joys and Frustrations of Pairing

CONCEPT:

Romantic attractions are a normal, healthy part of growing up. These relationships can make you feel on top of the world one minute and down in the dumps the next.

OBJECTIVE:

The students will recognize the nature of adolescent romances and this knowledge will help them through the ups and downs of these relationships, leaving their own self-esteem and the feelings of others in tact.

COMPETENCIES:

- 1. Identify the stages of adolescent attractions. ((1-1, 1-2)
- 2. Explore the ways relationships begin, develop, and grow. (2-1, 2-2, 2-3)
- 3. Identify purposes and importance of group socialization, and examine why every adolescent is not ready to date or pair at the same time.

- 4. Discuss appropriate activities for junior high dating/pairing, including the advantages of group socialization rather than paired dating at a young age, and the potential problems of early boy/girl pairing. (4-1, 4-2, 4-3, 4-4)
- 5. Examine the elements of infatuation and love. (5-1, 5-2, 5-3, 5-4, 5-5, 5-6, 5-7)
- 6. Identify reasons early adolescent romances are often short in duration and appropriate ways to end a relationship. (6-1, 6-2, 6-3, 6-4, 6-5, 6-6, 6-7)
