Intended Learning Outcomes

Instructional Procedures

Spelling words: am, at, cat, can, ran, man, a, the

Monday: Teach students half of the spelling words however you normally teach new words.

Tuesday: Finish teaching students the rest of the spelling words.

Wednesday: Play spelling detective with a poem or a story that has many at and an words for the students to find.

Thursday: Sort spelling words Friday: Play look, cover, and say.
