Uncover the little-known history of plantations and enslaved people in North Florida.

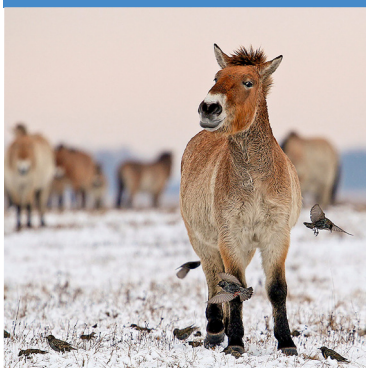
