- 3 ACCEPT STUDENT SUBMISSIONS ONLINE.**
Use dropITtoME.com to let students turn in files straight to your Dropbox account.
- 4 CREATE A BACKCHANNEL.**
Todaysmeet.com lets you create a private, temporary chat room students can enter via any web-enabled device.
- 5 KEEP CLASS LIVELY WITH A STUDENT RESPONSE SYSTEM.**
Socrative.com turns web-enabled devices into a clicker system.
- 6 PRESENT FROM THE CLOUD.**
Use Prezi or Google Drive to create, store, collaborate and present slide-based content.
- 7 GET YOUR WRITING ON.**
Let students collaborate on writing projects with Google Drive.
- 8 EDIT PHOTOS FROM THE CLOUDS.**
