Project Title: Historic Places of Lehi Created by: Roy Voeks Class: Heber CMaP 2010

Project Description	Students will locate, map, take pictures of and write descriptions of Historical homes, buildings and markers in the city of Lehi, Utah. Students will map the various sights using the GPS system as well as physical addresses. Students will also write short historical descriptions of each of the sights and take photos. After gathering this information students will create a GIS map that will have hyperlinks that show a picture and a written description of the various sights. The students will then develop a walking route that would incorporate the various sights.
Community Issue or Problem Selected -How project evolved?	Having students from the 7 th grade at Lehi Jr. High develop this project allows students to learn the history of their local community. The Huthching's Museum in Lehi would act as a distributor of the maps developed.

Project Objectives	*Students will learn to use the GPS (Global Positioning System) *Students will learn to use the ArcGIS (Geographic Information System) *Students will learn to collect and organize data. *Students will learn the history of Lehi City. *Students will write historical information pieces for each sight. *Students will learn to use a digital camera and upload photos for the walking maps.

Essential Question(s) -Spatial Issue	*What is the best route for a walking tour in the city of Lehi? *Why was a certain location chosen for a particular historical sight? *What local materials could have been used to build a particular sight or marker?
Assessments (rubrics, scoring guides)	50 % for identifying, mapping (with GPS coordinates) picture and historical information of each sight. 25% for uploading photos, hyperlinking sights and photos on GIS map. 25% for creating walking route and broacher between sights.
Project Products	 A list of all historical buildings and markers in Lemhi City. A GIS map of the above sights and the routes to visit each sight. A completed broacher that will tell of each sight along the walking route.

Skills Required	Students will learn to use GPS, GIS and Digital Camera. Students will learn to use the GIS map software and will further develop skills using word processors to write historical features.

Celebration/Presentation	Present the finished broacher and maps to City mayor and Chairman of the Hutchings Museum Board of Directors.
Project Evaluation	Students will be divided into teams of 4 and will be assigned a particular area of Lehi to identify historical buildings and markers. Based upon the quality and thoroughness of the information gathered and used a student can earn up to 100 points for the project
