Project Description	For over 20 years, the US Postal Service has participated in Stamp Out Hunger, a food drive in which letter carriers pick up food donations along their regular route on a Saturday in May. There is some concern that with the USPS discontinuing its Saturday service, this food drive will no longer take place and local food banks, like the Bountiful Food Pantry, will be short of much needed supplies. The purpose of this project is to organize a community-wide food drive to be held the same week the Stamp Out Hunger drive was traditionally held.
