

## **Revolutions List, Group, Label**

This activity can be used as an introduction to the vocabulary and ideas of these 6 revolutions. Students can then revisit it later in their studies to revise their ideas and personally assess their learning. Students could work individually or in small groups.

### Steps

1. Cut all of the cards apart.
2. Use the yellow cards as the categories/headers for each column.
3. Sort the rest of the cards into the appropriate groups/columns based on the characteristics of each revolution.
4. Have each student share with a group, or each group share with the class, their groupings and explain why they chose to group them that way.
5. After learning about the revolutions they can revise their lists, and it will help them summarize what they have learned about the concept.
