A DEGREE IN NUTRITION SCIENCE prepares students with a solid background in health and life sciences. Nutrition scientists study the molecular and cellular basis of human health and disease. They integrate principles of nutrition with related sciences such as anatomy, physiology, biochemistry, and medicine. This degree also prepares students to enter medical school and other professional schools, by providing experiences and opportunities in laboratory research, epidemiology, and clinical nutrition.
