How to Register for PREZI

- 1. Go to prezi.com
- 2. Select "Sign Up"
- 3. Choose Your PREZI License. I have always just used the free Public license, it has worked for my needs. If you want to save more PREZIs, work offline, or are uncomfortable with having your PREZIs public, you may want to choose either the Enjoy or Pro license for a monthly fee.
- 4. Enter your Personal Information and Create a Password
- 5. Agree to the Terms of Use and Sign Up!

Now you can create your own PREZIs!

Creating a PREZI

- 1. Select "New Prezi"
- 2. Select which template you would like, click "Choose"
- 3. Click anywhere on the canvas to add text
- 4. To add Frames or Arrows select "Frames and Arrows" and choose which you would like to add.
- 5. To insert images, videos, files, or PowerPoints select "**Insert**", choose the type of file you would like, find the file on your computer, select it, and it will upload to the screen.
- *You can then drag items wherever you would like it to go on the canvas.
- 6. To change the template or the color scheme of your current template, select "**Themes**" and choose the template or color scheme that you would like to change to.

PREZI Tips

- 3 Major Components of a PREZI (*taken from PREZI tutorial How to Create a Great PREZI)
 - o **Brainstorm:** Identify the components of what you are presenting (all of the information you want to share).
 - Organize: Group "like" ideas together to create structure in your PREZI. Use the template or search for other PREZIs to decide how you want to organize it.
 - o **Direct:** Zoom in to illustrate ideas, and out to give an overview of what is being covered.
 - o **The Squint Test:** While viewing the entire PREZI, squint to determine if your PREZI looks like a mess or is a "Sneeze" PREZI. While squinting, if you can determine the main idea of the PREZI, you have created a successful, interactive PREZI that will be beneficial to your student's learning.
