## The Journal Jar

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The journal jar is an activity where students/members are given the opportunity to write their "life story" and in the process learn more about themselves and their family.

## **Instructions:**

- 1. Read topics and choose those that fit your student dynamics and project needs. Cut topic ideas into strips, fold and place into a large jar and close lid.
- 2. Each day or meeting, a slip or slips are drawn from the jar. Students write the question, then write or type their answer to the question. (They could also ask these questions to family members)
- 3. Students will need a place to keep their record of thoughts and memories. (it is also helpful if they are in a format that will allow them to arrange and rearrange them after the jar has been emptied of all the slips of paper) Some ideas are:
  - a. On the computer.
  - b. On index cards, then stored in a sack or box (I like to have them decorate these with items describing them. This can be another activity of its own.)
  - c. In a journal or notebook, be sure to write on one side of the page only so that you can cut them apart later.
- 4. Once the Journal Jar has been emptied the students arrange their entries and find they have written their life story. These can be typed and bound for a very nice autobiography.

This is an activity for the classroom and FCCLA chapter. It can be incorporated into national programs like Power of One and Families First and with some creativity many more.

List each of your uncles and aunts and tell one thing about them.

Where did you live as a child? Describe the city, suburb or rural area.

What is your favorite flower?

What were your dreams growing up

What kind of music do you like? What was your first job? Tell about any special stories. What would you like to be remembered for? Did your mother work? Did she have any hobbies? What is your advice to those ounger than you? What did your father do for a living? Describe his typical work day. Do you remember your first date? Tell about it. What convinced you most to choose your spouse? Do you have a close relationship with any of your grandparents? Tell about it. Tell about a fascinating experience you've had while doing laundry. Tell about some of your neighbors when you were a child. Tell a family story that has been handed down to you. Describe your first crush. What was he/she like? Describe your yard as a child and what you did there. What memories does Thanksgiving as a child bring back? Tell about a favorite vacation from your childhood. Tell about your parents' philosophy on raising children, discipline, rules, etc. Do you remember your grandparents? Great Grandparents? Any stories? What makes each of your brothers and sisters special? Be specific. What makes you feel good? (Occasions, people, food, etc.) How many brothers and sisters do you have? Tell a story about each of them. When shopping with your mother, where did you like most and least to go? What things do you enjoy doing today that you enjoyed doing as a child? Where were you and what was a typical day like at age 11? Where were you and what was a typical day like at age 15? One word on how to live successfully would be what? Tell about getting a haircut as a child. Did you go to a barber or get it cut at home? Did you have roommates or companions in college? Tell about them. Describe your mother's wedding dress. What do you know about her wedding? Tell about all of the places you have worked. What did you want to be when you grew up? How did it turn out? Tell about some of the most notable people in your hometown. Tell about special anniversaries that you remember. Do you have a special school memory? High school or college? Tell about a special date you had with a boy/girl friend. Write about some place you went with just your father and what you did there. What is your favorite animal? Tell why. Do you prefer to correspond by email or would you rather send a regular letter? Did you wish you had more brothers and sisters? Why? Tell which radio or TV programs you liked best while growing up. What do you know about how the Great Depression affected your family? Tell about the births of your children. Does your father have any hobbies or special talents? What did your family do for entertainment when you were a child? What is the one invention you could not live without and why? Tell about any exciting experiences in scouting, 4-H, or other such activities. Where were you and what was a typical day like at age 7? Tell about the changes you have seen in your lifetime - technology, fads, etc. What did your grandfather do for a living? Did your grandmother work? Tell about dreams, expectations, and hopes you have for each of your children. Tell about favorite games you played as a child. What personality traits do you admire most in others? What was your favorite Sunday activity as a child? What was your greatest joy? Was there a special saying that your father always said? Were you in a band and/or choir? What memories do you have of that? Tell about family reunions. Did you have a childhood hideout? Describe where, when, and what it looked like. What was your most embarrassing moment? Where would you like to live most of all and why? What changes in clothes and fashion have you seen during your lifetime? Did you have a bicycle? What was it like? What kind of music lessons do you wish you could have taken? (Piano, violin, etc.) Describe a typical day in elementary school. Pescribe your favorite outfit/dress as a child. Tell about your mother - personality, characteristics, stature, talents, etc. ell about home cures or old wives tales for curing hiccups, warts, colds, etc. What do you like to do in your spare time? What hobbies do you have? hare a principle you have learned or one you have taught. Did you have a favorite toy as a child? Did it have a name? [Sell about the places/towns that your parents have lived in. What is your personal secret for happiness? Were there any events (world, local or personal) that changed your life? How do you feel about death? Tell about your philosophy of life. hat are your most precious and deeply embedded customs or family traditions? What is your favorite piece of furniture? hat do you remember about being a teenager? What did you do for fun? Describe each of your children and tell something about them. ell about your teenager social life, friends, dances, movies, dating, etc. Where were you and what was a typical day like at age 27? What kind of sports did you play, watch, and like as a youth? How about now? What do/did you do for a living? How did you choose this occupation?

How do you feel about dentists? Why? Did you have a favorite subject in school? .Was there one you dreaded? What kind of extracurricular activities did you participate in as a child? How did you like your place in the family? Were you oldest, youngest, middle etc.? What is the biggest lesson in life you have found to be true? Think back. Have you ever seen the ocean? Which ones and under what circumstances? What was your greatest sorrow? Write the words of a song from your childhood. What memories does it bring back?
