 Frame—a molding that covers the casing to frame the window

 Sash—a piece of wood or metal that holds the glass in place

 Casing (Jamb)—the part of the window that fits into the wall

 Glass—window panes

Sill—a narrow shelf at the bottom of the window Apron—molding beneath the sill of the window
