JOB INTERVIEW ASSIGNMENT

Select a job with an interior design background such as working in a furniture store, floral shop, home improvement store, or the household department of a store. The job should be one for which you are presently qualified. All information should be factual. All materials, other than letters of recommendation, must be the work of the participant.

- Prepare a portfolio of materials that represent your work. Grading will be on neatness (typed or written in ink), correct spelling and grammar, organization and relevance of the materials presented.
 - A. The portfolio will contain up to 6 divider pages, and 25 content pages.
 - B. The portfolio will include:
 - 1. A cover sheet
 - 2. Job specification sheet with name of employer
 - 3. Job title
 - 4. Short job description
 - 5. Required hours and wages typically offered for this job
 - C. Business communication:
 - 1. Cover letter
 - 2. Resume
 - 3. Two letters of recommendation
 - D. Understanding of job (school-based learning, work-based learning)
 - E. Career development planning—Application of family and consumer science skills and their relationship to job seeking/job keeping
 - F. Example of written work that demonstrates the participant's ability to communicate effectivelyup to 5 examples of special skills, talents and or abilities related to the job and career interest/goals
 - G. Complete an application in the presence of your teacher, using your resume, a dictionary and reference cards. Application forms must be completed in black or blue ink. The application form will ask:
 - 1. Personal information—name, address, social security number
 - Education—name and address of schools attended, dates of attendance, extracurricular activities
 - 3. Former employment—dates of employment, names and addresses of employers, salary, reason for leaving
 - 4. Information about the job desired, including salary expected
 - H. Participate in an interview. Sample questions may include:
 - 1. How does this job relate to interior design?
 - 2. Do you enjoy working with other people or would you rather work alone?
 - 3. What preparation have you had for this job?
 - 4. What skills do you possess that will make you successful in this job?
 - 5. Good problem solving skills include a careful review of facts and weighing options before making a decision. How have you reached a practical decision by reviewing facts and weighing options?
 - Describe a time when you were successful in dealing with an unstructured work environment.
 - 7. Describe an experience that illustrates your ability to be watchful and alert when supervising individuals or monitoring instruments/displays.
 - 8. What do you want to be doing five years from now?
 - 9. What do you consider to be your greatest strengths?

NOTE: To compete in the area, state and national Job Interview STAR Event obtain an official set of rules. A rating sheet, included with the packet, can be used for grading.
