

FURNITURE JOINT MATCH--KEY

Match each name below with the proper illustration by writing the number of the illustration in the space provided.

- F TONGUE AND GROOVE: One board is cut with a projecting tongue that fits into a recessed groove on the opposite board. This joint is used where several boards are to be joined lengthwise.
- C BUTT: When one board is glue or nailed flush to another board. This is a weak joint.
- A DOUBLE DOWEL: Glued wooden dowels fit into drilled holes in both pieces of wood. The quality of this joint relies on the strength of the dowel. It is used in interior frames of upholstered furniture.
- B CORNER BLOCK: A joint that supports and reinforces the furniture frame. It keeps one side from pulling away from the other. It is used in chairs and tables. It may be glued and wood screwed in quality pieces of furniture.
- E MORTISE AND TENON: A notch is made in a solid piece of wood and is then fitted tightly into a hole cut in an adjoining piece of wood. One of the strongest joints used in furniture.
- D DOVETAIL: A joint used to fasten two pieces of wood that meet at right angles. It is used in quality casegoods.
