UNIT I: Teenage Transitions TOPIC E: Using Good Judgment

CONCEPT:

Good judgment means you consider the risks and weigh the consequences when making decisions so that you can weed out choices that may cause harmful or disastrous consequences to life or health.

OBJECTIVE:

The student will define good judgment, relate how these skills can prevent a crisis, and examine the consequences of the lack of good judgment and the rewards of using good judgment.

COMPETENCIES:

- 1. Define the term *good judgment* and identify skills necessary to make good judgment. (1-1)
- 2. Differentiate between making a decision and making good judgments. (2-1, 2-2)
- 3. Examine how lack of using these skills can cause a crisis. (3-1, 3-2)
- 4. Establish responsibility for personal judgments and consequences. (4-1, 4-2, 4-3, 4-4)
- 5. Analyze common judgment situations and apply the critical thinking process. (5-1, 5-2)
- 6. Identify activities some teenagers pursue that might be considered indicative of poor judgment or risk-taking behaviors. (6-1, 6-2)
