There are many resources that can be used in talking about abuse.</p> <p>Info that <u>must</u> be covered:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Types of Abuse (sexual, physical, verbal, emotional)—what they are, and how often they occur and what to watch for, especially in children • Physical and emotional neglect—I think this one isn't touched on a lot, but still very important • Identification responsibility and documentation—when are you responsible to report abuse, when should you or shouldn't you? What if it is a family member? • Reporting Procedures for abuse and neglect—Who do you contact and how. Do you have to have documentation or any specific info?
