

Types of Play

1. Solitary play
 - playing alone with toys
2. Onlooker play
 - watching others play
3. Parallel play
 - playing side by side, but not a lot of playing together
4. Cooperative play
 - playing together to accomplish a task
5. Creative play
 - using materials to create something
 - blocks, crayons, paint, sand
6. Dramatic play/
 - pretend play
 - props for school, house, doctor, etc.
7. Destructive play
 - break things down into smaller parts or changing them into something else
 - learn by taking things apart
