The much-younger sister of the famed Sherlock, 15-year-old Enola takes her own cases and goes undercover to find the truth about a woman's disappearance.


Lock & Mori by Heather Petty

May 13 *Woman in Green* (1945)

May 20 *Sherlock Holmes and the Secret Weapon* (1942)

This adventure borrows from Doyle's "The Adventure of the Dancing Men" to reimagine Holmes and Watson as World War II counterspies.



May 27 *The Triumph of Sherlock Holmes* (1935)

Starring Arthur Wontner as Holmes, this adaptation of Doyle's novel *The Valley of Fear* places the Victorian detective in a 1930s setting.
