WildWEST Grant Update (Hat Ranch Activity)

During the recent visit to Hat Ranch, the focus was on planning for the next 12 months. Discussions centered around training initiatives and outreach efforts at both the national and regional levels. The team also identified key groups and target areas that should be prioritized for outreach moving forward.

BLM Fire Camera Proposal

The grant is currently in a 60-day review period with BLM. If approved, it will fund approximately 20 fire cameras to be deployed across various sites in Utah over the next five years.

This initiative is a collaborative effort involving the Utah Communications Authority, UDOT, BLM, and several other partners. Together, they will identify strategic locations throughout the state for camera placement, enhancing fire monitoring and response capabilities.

UDOT Activities

UDOT has been able to secure most of the 4.9 GHz net spectrum in the state of Utah.

Start of School Update

Some districts have implemented a policy prohibiting personal devices in the classroom. Since its rollout, a few devices have been confiscated and returned to parents. Notably, there have been no repeat violations, indicating strong compliance with the new policy.
