In 2012, the program became the Office of Undergraduate Research. In 2015, the Office stopped printing the journal and disseminated the publications as a website. And In 2023, to revitalize the journal into something that could be indexed and archived, under Dr. Fukushima's leadership the journal was revamped to be more collaborative with a student editor, staff, as *RANGE: Undergraduate Research Journal*. The journal was published for the first time with UEN Pressbooks in 2023. To inaugurate the new platform, the students renamed the journal from Undergraduate Research Journal to *RANGE: Undergraduate Research Journal*.
