Sunday, March 22 at 7:30 p.m.

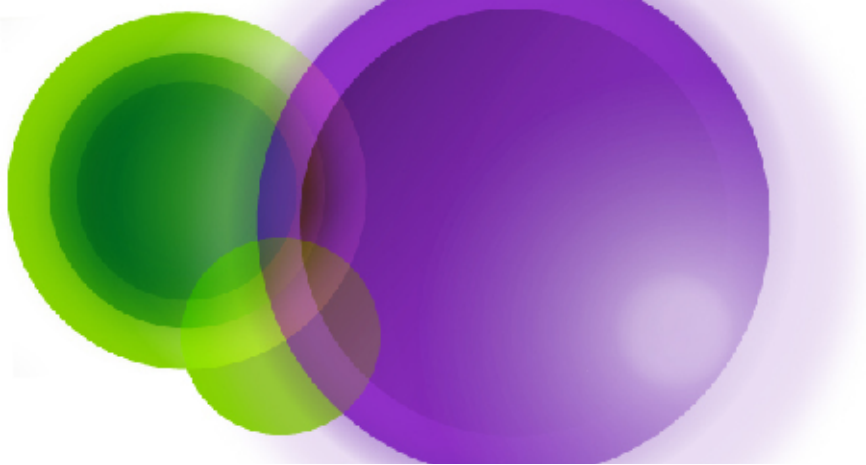
What happens when art and science are combined in the creative minds of teens? This film follows teenagers in a Young Composers class in Northern California as they spend a year learning river science and how it all relates to the life cycle of the salmon. Their challenges turn that experience into music that creates a sense of the river and the life that depends on the river. The result? A beautifully photographed, moving musical tribute to the Yuba River and the life cycle of the salmon told through fully orchestrated music written by the talented teenagers.



### ARC OF LIGHT: A PORTRAIT OF ANNA CAMPBELL BLISS

Sunday, March 29 at 7:30 p.m.

Salt Lake's, Anna Campbell Bliss is a pioneering artist, architect and designer who has devoted her life to the creation of works of art that explore the complex intersections between art, technology, science, nature, poetry, mathematics and architecture. The film looks at the astonishing range of Bliss's work, from small painterly and digitally based studies of color and light to architectural site commissions of immense scale. It also puts her work in art-historical context and traces her Modernist influences, including the Bauhaus school artists of the 1920s.
