Follow the path of Chinese who helped build California.



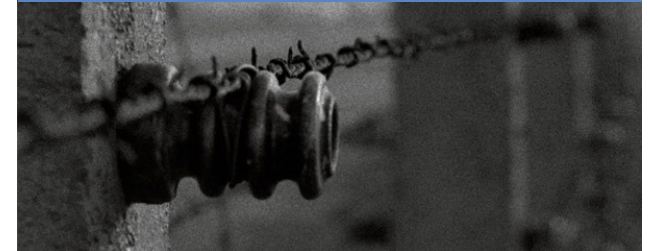
Pidgin: The Voice of Hawaii
