The global story of the emerald trade.



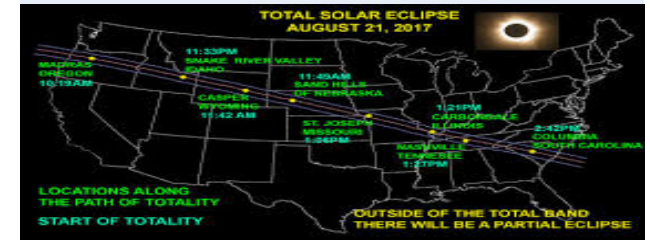
### National Aviation Day / Beyond the Powder: The Legacy of the First Women's Cross Country Air Race
