
Once upon a time in a small town in Maine lived a small boy.




Now this boy was like every other boy. He played the same, he ate the same, and he talked the same.



There was only one small difference between him and the other boys. He was blind. This boy was brilliant. he could have done anything in hte world he wanted to.




He was teased and shunned because he was different than all of the other children.
